***Plan to make at least one trip to the financial aid office on campus prior to enrollment.**

*Financial aid is based on **need** as determined by federal regulations. Information used to determine need must come from you about yourself and/or your family. 1/3 of students who apply for financial aid will be asked to verify the information provided & these individuals are randomly selected by the federal government.

*The Federal Pell Grant is **based on full-time attendance** and is pro-rated if you attend less than full-time.

*It usually takes 4-6 weeks for a paper FAFSA application to be completely processed if mailed. **You are encouraged to complete the FAFSA application online** at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Please make sure to fully complete the applications including all required signatures or processing time is delayed.

*You must provide proof that you have a high school diploma or GED to be eligible for Title IV Federal aid. You must also maintain **satisfactory attendance** and have at least a **“C” average** to remain eligible for financial aid.

*The financial aid fiscal year begins on July 1st each year and ends on June 30th the following year. Financial awards are made based on the portion of that year you are attending. If you are awarded financial aid and do not attend the full period for which you receive aid, you may be required to pay back some of the aid.

*All sources of educational funding are combined to form a “Financial Aid Package”. This is done to prevent an overpayment that would result in you owing money back to the school. You are required to report to the financial aid office any aid received from any agency or private organization.

*Some financial aid may be taxable. To determine this you should contact your tax preparer or the IRS.
